



LAHJA Adult Horsemastership Competition Information

The LAHJA Horsemastership Competition encourages and rewards amateurs to develop comprehensive knowledge and understanding of hunter/jumper sport, their equine partners, and general horsemanship.

Competitors must be current members of LAHJA. Amateur competitors can compete in one of two categories: Overall and Knowledge Phase Only. The overall competition consists of two phases, a Knowledge Phase and a Riding Phase. The Knowledge Phase will be held at a designated LAHJA horse show during the fall. The Riding Phase requires competitors to submit a video from any jumping round at a current year competition, which will be judged on equitation.

Knowledge Phase

This phase will count 70% toward each competitor's overall score.

The Knowledge Phase will be held during a designated LAHJA show during the fall of each year and will take about 20-30 minutes to complete. Competitors will be tested on general stable management practices and activities, general horsemanship knowledge, and familiarity with USEF hunter, jumper, and equitation rules.

Examples of activities include:

- Identification of feed, bits, and "mystery" substances.
- Put a bridle together.
- Recognize conformation traits, markings, parts of the horse.
- Basic horse health and common diseases.

Riding Phase

This phase will count 30% toward each competitor's overall score.

By November 15, submit a video from a jumping round at a horse show during the current competition year. The competitor may use a round from a hunter class, equitation class, or jumper class. The round will be judged as either a hunter seat or jumping seat equitation round based on the class type the competitor selects. The jumping round must be a minimum of cross rails with eight fences and cantering.

The video must be posted on You Tube by November 15. The competitor must submit a statement to LAHJA stating the date and name of the show, the name of the class, as well as listing which divisions and sections the competitor competes in.

Scoring

The Knowledge Phase will be worth 100 points and 70% of that score will count toward the overall standings. The Riding Phase will also be worth 100 points and 30% of that score will count toward the overall standings. Two judges will judge and score the Riding Phase. At least one of the judges will be a USEF R Equitation judge and the other will be an experienced professional.

The two scores will be added together and the competitor with the highest combined score will be declared the winner, with the rest of the participants ranked in order of score, high to low. In case of a tie, the Knowledge Phase score will serve as the tiebreaker.

Study Materials

The Knowledge Phase will be based on material in the USHJA Horsemanship Quiz Challenge Study Guide and the US Pony Club manuals. However, contestants are encouraged to utilize a broad range of sources and materials to develop comprehensive knowledge.

Awards

The results of the competition will be kept secret until presented at the annual LAHJA Awards Banquet. Competitors are strongly encouraged to attend the awards ceremony and presentation.

LAHJA will present the following awards:

- Overall Champion: \$250 gift certificate and ribbon
- Overall Reserve Champion: \$150 gift certificate and ribbon
- Third Overall: \$100 gift certificate and ribbon
- Knowledge Phase Champion: \$250 gift certificate and ribbon
- Knowledge Phase Reserve Champion: \$150 gift certificate and ribbon
- Third Knowledge Phase: \$100 gift certificate and ribbon

Registration

Participants must be current LAHJA members and must complete a registration form. There is no additional fee to participate. Registration must be completed by the date of the Knowledge Phase.
